

ECCL Report: May 10, 2019

Executive Summary: 183rd meeting of the Estero Council of Community Leaders



- Estero Forever Foundation: The Village of Estero, working with the ECCL and Estero Chamber of Commerce, established the Estero Forever Foundation. Their goal is to have resources to support the needs of the Estero community and not have to rely on others to fund projects.
- ECCL Estero Advocacy Foundation (EAF) is a Field of Interest Fund and a component fund
 of the Southwest Florida Community Foundation (SWFCF): purpose is to secure private
 funding and government and private grants to support ECCL advocacy activities and
 operating needs that contribute to increasing the quality of life in Estero. Donations to the
 EAF provide ECCL the opportunity to target our support for policies, programs and projects
 most important to the community.
- Connecting Preserve and Mitigation areas: The Preserve at Corkscrew is willing to work with the Village of Estero to include their mitigation land into the Village's Edison Farms project. This is a win-win for the Estero community and our environment.
- Estero Fire Rescue: Governor DeSantis signed the Florida Firefighter Cancer Bill. It provides new benefits to firefighters who are diagnosed with cancer. The bill treats cancer and cancer deaths like on-the-job injuries and deaths. 1 in 5 firefighters get cancer, far exceeding the national average. This is good news for firefighters.

- **EFR Pension Board** Mark Novitski and Bob Lienesch were approved for another 4-year term.

- Challenges of Building EFR Station 45 (East Corkscrew Rd)
 - Approvals and permits are currently working through the system for new location
 - In 1 year, there should be a temporary set-up building and then, by October 2022 a permanent fire station.
 - The station is located 3.5 miles east of Alico Rd and Corkscrew Rd intersection and 1.3 miles east of the main entrance to the Place.

- Prepare for hurricane season

VILLAGE REPORT

- Councilmember Jim Boesch
- Perspective on Lee County Board of Commissioners
 - Due to the Village's strong financial standing, County Commissioners seem to think Estero should incur all cost for improvements in the Village even those that are the responsibility of the County.
- We need a County Commissioner who is interested in South Lee County
 - Several candidates are interested in filling the seat left vacant by the untimely death of Commissioner Larry Kiker, including the Commissioner's widow, Paula Kiker and Estero Village Councilmember Nick Batos.
 - Estero Village Council endorses fellow Councilmember and long-time Estero resident Nick Batos for this position. The Council shared this endorsement with Governor Rick DeSantis
 - Councilman Boesh asked all attendees to write Governor DeSantis supporting Nick Batos for the position of Lee County Commissioner. Councilman Boesch also asked attendees to speak with neighbors and their community HOA Boards asking that they support Nick and write letters to the Governor.

 - Thanks to the hard work of Lisa Griggs Roberson, CPA Finance Director, and her staff
- Village is developing a 10-year plan to make Estero even better with focus on 8 broad areas:
 - Access for enjoyment of the Lee County 2020 property Edison Farms
 - Expanding use of Koreshan State Park recreation and enjoyment
 - Teaming with Corkscrew Sanctuary on maintaining the natural beauty, wildlife habitat, and groundwater filtering
 - Developing an education complex with all K-12 schools

- Working to develop youth athletics for local youth in our community so they don't have to travel outside Estero
- Build a local theater for local and outside shows
- Find a way to provide a boat/ferry to bring residents and guests from Koreshan State park to Lovers Key State park
- Build and operate an Arts and Cultural center

• Estero Roads construction

- Estero Parkway Renovation has started with construction taking 6-9 months, depending on weather
- I75 and Corkscrew Rd interchange construction to start in October

• Town Center Property

- New hospital maybe in the works
- Workforce housing for hospital employees will be needed
- Plans for the property include businesses on the ground floor and housing on the 2nd and 3rd floors
- SFWMD may help remove the silt in the Estero river
- Design Review Board vacancies
 - The Village Council is accepting applications for the board.
