





Caloosahatchee Watershed









SFWMD Ecological Targets for Caloosahatchee Estuary

Low Flow


• < 450 cfs: high salinity in upper estuary causes mortality of tape grass habitat (data suggest 650 cfs).

High Flow

- >2800 cfs: low salinity causes mortality of marine organisms in seaward portion of the estuary.
- >4500 cfs: low salinity in San Carlos Bay causes mortality of seagrasses.
- >6500 cfs: low salinity plume enters Gulf of Mexico adverse impacts on SAV and WQ in Pine Island Sound.



What is a Minimum Flow and Level (MFL)?

- A MFL is the "limit at which further withdrawals would be significantly harmful to the water resources or ecology of the area." (Section 373.042(1), Florida Statutes)
- SFWMD defines significant harm as "the temporary loss of water resource functions which result from a change in surface or groundwater hydrology, that takes more that two years to recover, but which is considered less severe than serious harm."

Why are we challenging the Proposed MFL Update?

- The proposed rule is <u>less</u> protective than the 2001 rule (flow target vs. salinity target).
- Shifts the ecological baseline away from a sensitive ecological indicator habitat (i.e., tape grass) and averages it over several less sensitive indicators.
- Would result in higher dry season salinities and impacts to all organisms that depend on the low-salinity zone (0.5-6 psu).





